Authorized Users

Unless agreed to otherwise, the following authorized user definitions are generally accepted by both the Licensor and Institution:

- The Institution's current faculty, employees, students, alumni, current affiliated and visiting researchers, current regular and contract staff, and other users granted access to the campus/institutional network.
- Authorized users may access content from remote locations.
- Visitors to the Institution, such as walk-in users, are also allowed to use the content while on the Institution's premises, but are understood to lose this access upon departure and are excluded from remote access privileges.

Authorized Use

Use of the content is generally governed by German copyright law. Authorized uses include any uses permitted under the appropriate existing copyright law, including, where applicable, uses permitted as fair use.

Accepted uses include:

- Interlibrary loan.
- Scholarly sharing of single articles and chapters by individuals for purposes of scholarship or private study.
- Linking to the content at the Licensor's site for use in courses is also acceptable.
- Using the Subscribed Content to perform and engage in text and/or data-mining activities ("TDM") in accordance with the rights of researchers under the German Copyright Act for academic research, scholarship, and other educational, noncommercial purposes; utilizing and sharing the results of TDM in the Authorized User's scholarly work with proper attribution; and making the results available for use by others for the foregoing purposes; Downloaded metadata and Subscribed Content may be stored locally for the duration of a TDM project but must be permanently deleted upon completion of the project.

Inappropriate Use

Both Licensor and Institution will make reasonable efforts to prevent the misuse of the content and limit access to authorized users and will not knowingly allow unauthorized users to gain access.

While the Institution cannot control user behavior, an obligation to inform users of appropriate uses of the content is acknowledged, and the Institution will cooperate with the Licensor to resolve problems of inappropriate use.

When questionable activity such as systematic downloading is detected, the Licensor should notify the Institution as soon as possible. If the Institution detects inappropriate use, the Licensor should be notified as soon as possible. Both Licensor and Institution should strive to resolve the incident quickly.

Suspension of access for the Institution by a Licensor may be necessary but should be an action of last resort and notification will precede any suspension of access. Because legitimate activity (for example, access from a proxy server address or authorized data mining for research purposes) can sometimes be mistaken for systematic abuse, whenever possible Licensor should employ appropriate techniques to detect true misuse and follow industry standards in this area as they emerge.
