Plan ahead to make your research data available to the whole world

As a scientist, the day will come when you have to publish your research data openly accessible:

Did you know that journals like Nature have new policies for authors on data availability and citation? And that research funders now require applicants to specify how their research data will be made available to other researchers?

Unless you have a convincing strategy, funding agencies might not even consider your grant application.

But don't panic if you haven't got a research data dissemination plan so far. As a Max Planck researcher, you have free access to Edmond, the Max Planck Society's open access data repository.

In Edmond, you can publish data from all disciplines as citable research objects with a persistent DOI. Your data will be openly accessible, fully reusable and archived for at least the next 10 years. Further on, Edmond complies with funding organization guidelines, is easy to use, fast and secure.
